#### **Doggett's Coat and Badge**

The Doggett's Coat and Badge is a sculling tradition that goes back to 1715. The oldest annual sporting event in the world is rowed each year between London Bridge and the Swan, Chelsea (now Cadogan Pier). Named after Thomas Doggett, an actor, it was inaugurated in 1715 with the prize of a scarlet coat and a silver badge for the winner and various monetary prizes for the finishers. Six Watermen traditionally contest the race within a year of the completion of their apprenticeships. You can find on various internet sites and from published literature the names of the winners of the race in any year but it is more difficult to locate a list of the other rowers in an particular race. This information is of interest to family historians that are researching a link with the river and may help to establish or confirm a family connection.

We have collated data from various sources to make that information available and whilst it is not complete yet it still provides a fascinating insight into the other competitors in this famous race.
